


WHO IS CJCC?

CURRENT INITIATIVES

Safety and Justice Challenge (SJC)

A national network of communities and subject-matter experts funded by the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation with the goal of safely reducing the local inmate population and addressing racial and ethnic disparities in the justice system affecting individuals and communities. East Baton Rouge has been a member of the network since 2017.

Pre-Trial Diversion & Recovery Program

A program that assesses jailed individuals charged with non-violent crimes who are unable to afford bail and have identifiable mental health or substance abuse challenges. Program staff work to provide safer, more effective alternatives to incarceration.

Rapid Case Assessment Team (RCAT)

An effort launched to identify and address racial and ethnic disparities within the justice system and deliver an efficient and equitable process that results in quicker case-processing and a decreased jail population.
